Yesterday at school, Mrs. Thompson's fourth grade class learned about the Chinese New Year and the Chinese Zodiac. Four friends spent recess that day giggling over how each of their pets had a Chinese Zodiac of a different kind of animal, each of which happened to be one of their friend's pets. Determine the full name of each child, their pet's name and what it is, and what each pet's animal is from the Chinese Zodiac.

Note: No pet has a Chinese Zodiac of the same pet type. For example, the dog doesn't have a dog for a Chinese Zodiac animal.

1. Whiskers is not a snake. Cindy's pet is named Fluffy but Fluffy is not a rat.
2. The rabbit's zodiac animal is not the dog. Billy's last name isn't Snow.
3. Ms. White doesn't have the snake but that's her pet's zodiac animal.
4. Lucky is a dog. Mike Brown doesn't have a pet with a zodiac animal of a rabbit.
5. The four friends are represented by the boy whose last name is Wish, the pet named Spots, the pet with a zodiac animal of a rabbit, and the girl who has a dog.
6. Sally does not have a rat for a pet. The zodiac animal for Billy's pet is not a rat.
