## Winter Olympics

This year, February heralds the start of the Winter Olympics. As well attended as always, with marvelous athletes from many different countries, the Winter Olympics were held successfully in the northern reaches of Canada. The weather was cold, but clear, and many events held the tension of closely matched competition. At the end of the Winter Olympics, five countries and one each of their athletes ended with significantly more Olympic medals than other contestants. Determine the full name of each of these extraordinary athletes, how many medals each won, the country each represented (one was Russia), and the total number of medals each of these countries took home.

1. In no particular order, the five top countries are represented by: Canada, the country which won 31 medals, the athlete with 8 medals, Mary, and Mr. Wells.
2. The athlete from Greece won one more medal than the person whose last name was Straight, but less medals than Manuel. The USA won 29 medals.
3. Marcus, whose last name wasn't Trader, won 9 medals but while he won the most individual medals, his country won 24 medals, the least of the top five countries.
4. Ms. Sciatta didn't receive 7 medals. Mr. Webster didn't represent the country that won 34 medals.
5. The athlete whose last name was Straight represented Sweden and won 5 medals, the least number of individual medals of the top five athletes. Madeline didn't represent the country that won 26 medals.
6. Mary didn't represent Greece. Mark, whose last name wasn't Trader, represented Canada.
